

## CONSTITUTION

## ARTICLE 6 <br> EXECUTIVE BOARD

SECTION 1. The Executive Board of this Church shall be no fewer than 5 in number, and shall have power to organize itself by choosing a chairman, secretary, and treasurer, whose duties shall be such as usually pertain to their respective offices. It shall also have the power to appoint all necessary agents and committees for the conduct of its work. Such work will be done through much prayer and seeking the Holy Spirit to lead and guide in all of its functions.

SUBSECTION A. The Chairman is the Pastor of the church. The Head Elder will serve as Vice-Chairman. He will lead and direct when the Chairman is not available for whatever reason. The other Officers of the Board will be the Secretary and Treasurer. The remaining members of the Executive Board will be elected every four years and reviewed biannually.
SUBSECTION B. All those serving in any of these positions on the Executive Board, or any Committee formed by the Board, will be contingent upon their upholding of Articles 2-4 of this Constitution based on their individual covenant with God to so uphold. Failure to uphold said Articles will result in the following: (1) the application of Matthew 18:15-18 to establish such failure as true; (2) Opportunity given for counseling, or retraining to remove the error or failure as it exists before any other steps are taken, always seeking after the Holy Spirit to do so in a spirit of God's love and mercy; (3) Refusal of counsel, rejection of counsel, or return to error after previous steps will result in the reapplication of Step 1 and upon determination of truth, the person
will be declared Apostate and be removed from office; will further be declared anathema for preaching another Gospel as set forth by the Apostle Paul in Galatians 1:8, 9 and removed from church membership without sincere repentance of same; or (4) Resignation. Said leader will not return to office after second offense regardless of restoration to fellowship upon repentance. Removal is pursuant to application of Article 9 of this Constitution.
SECTION 2. The Executive Committee is a subsidiary of the Board, whose purpose is to deal with the day to day activities of the Church. When such action becomes necessary that is not considered a day to day activity, it will be presented to the Executive Board for discussion and approval. The Executive Committee will hold office until their successors are appointed, by whatever reason deemed necessary by the Executive Board as led by the Spirit of God.
SECTION 3. All actions of the Executive Board, Committee, or assigned groups will be solely for this church. Any action necessary to be taken in behalf of a separate and distinct congregation, ministry, individual, etc., will only be taken after much prayer and consultation and discussion with as many other leaders as may be contacted within the Confederation.
